serendipity /ˌserən'dɪpəti/

n. 意外发现的美好；机缘巧合的幸运

例：I found my favorite café by pure serendipity while wandering the old town.

pernicious /pə'niʃəs/

adj. 有害的；致命的；恶性的

例：Social media can have a pernicious effect on adolescent self-esteem.

quiescent /kwi'esnt/

adj. 静止的；休眠的；不活跃的

例：Volcanoes may seem quiescent for decades before suddenly erupting.

vicarious /vɪ'keriəs/

adj. 间接体验的；替代性感受的

例：I live vicariously through my friend's travel vlogs from Patagonia.

luminous /'luːmɪnəs/

adj. 发光的；明亮的；清晰的

例：Her luminous prose illuminated even the most complex ideas.

obfuscate /'ɒːbfʌsket/

v. 故意使困惑；混淆；模糊

例：Politicians often obfuscate the truth with complex jargon.
